New Colonies

The Grand Lodge has authorized two new colonies: Phi Triton at Syracuse University in Syracuse, New York and Tau Tetraton at Johnson and Wales University in Providence, Rhode Island.

As it happens, with Phi Triton, the "triton" (i.e. "third") expansion of the Greek alphabet is now complete, and Tau Tetraton initiates the next level. "Tetraton" (i.e., "fourth") is the Homeric variant of the more common modern Greek form "tetarton" and was chosen for reasons of euphony as well as its Homeric overtones.

An interest group at **Dickinson College** in Carlisle, Pennsylvania, also hopes to revive Sigma Charge, inactive since 1895.

Former PGL Jeff Swenson Talks about Autism Speaks

y experiences with Theta Delta Chi, both as an undergraduate brother of Epsilon Triton, and as a six-year officer of the Grand Lodge, always make the "cut" when I reflect on what has shaped my life, both personally and as a leader in the business community. Why? Because it is evident in my personal experience, and in my view of many friends and business colleagues around me, that fraternities foster leadership, integrity and a commitment to living to a higher standard of character — traits that are a key ingredient to success and the foundation for building a meaningful life.

Think about it. In college, fraternities provide a framework for learning the ropes: how to lead and participate as part of a group; what it means to become actively engaged in a community or organization, and what sort of projects will be worthy of our time and talent. It's been more than two decades since my days as the 54th President of the Grand Lodge. I feel blessed to have had the honor of leading our elite organization with 140 years of history at that time. I stretched and grew with the experience, and today, as I embark on a new journey, it is exciting to see how some things come full circle.

TDX recently selected Autism Speaks as its official national philanthropy partner. Their college program, Autism Speaks U, will become a wonderful outlet for TDX undergrads to get involved on campuses and in their local community through a variety of volunteer-driven and fundraising projects happening throughout the country. Talk about a great opportunity to develop leadership skills!

For me, this recent announcement couldn't have come at a more profound or relevant time. Just weeks before hearing the news, I accepted the role as Chairman for the 2012 Arizona Walk Now for Autism Speaks, benefiting both Autism Speaks and the Arizona-based Southwest Autism Research & Resource Center (SARRC), one of the largest autism awareness and fundraising events in the country. My decision to take a stand for autism and Autism Speaks is twofold. I believe we all have a responsibility to seek out ways to improve the quality of life for those around us. My wife of 24 years, Lisa, and I are blessed with three healthy boys — our oldest, an active brother of Sigma Chi at the University of Arizona, and twin boys who are high school sophomores (hopefully future Theta Delts)! I feel we were remarkably fortunate given the startling high statistics of boys born with autism. At the same time, I cannot help but feel a true sense of urgency to uncover the causes of autism and to develop resources that will help support the skyrocketing numbers of children being diagnosed with this disorder.

My first introduction to autism was in early 2006, when some friends approached me to help fundraise for the creation of a vocational and life skills center to help young adults and adults affected by autism. The Phoenix community rallied to support SARRC, raising upwards of \$500,000 to make the center a reality. At that time, roughly one in 166 children nationwide was being diagnosed with autism — a statistic that hit home hard when my very close friends learned that their 2-year-old son, Jack, was born with the disorder. Today, the prevalence rate is an estimated 110 children — an increase due both to better diagnosis and screening and to awareness education — thanks to Autism Speaks, the nation's largest autism science and advocacy organization.



Autism truly is a disorder that affects us all — whether it's firsthand, through a child's classmate, friend, and neighbor or perhaps even as a future grandparent. As both a Theta Delt alumni and proud supporter of Autism Speaks, I would like to personally invite fellow undergrad and alumni brothers to support Autism Speaks' walks throughout the country. The opportunity to make a difference is truly rewarding and will surely make the "cut" when remembering experiences that shape your own character.



Omie Deut Dedicates WWII and Vietnam Memorial Plaque

n November 4, 2011, 100 undergraduates, alumni, and friends crowded the Charge House of Omicron Deuteron (Dartmouth College) at 11 West Wheelock Street in Hanover, New Hampshire to dedicate a memorial plaque in honor of the brothers of Omie Deut killed in action in World War II and the Vietnam War. The plague is now mounted on the wall above the fireplace in the library of the Charge House. It honors the following brothers: Norbert B. Hamilton, Jr. '40; Phillips G. Huffman '40; Merrill A. Prentice '40; Jay C. Griffith, Jr. '42; William W. Cabell, Jr. '43; Rogers Blood '44; Roger E. Washburn '45, William Smoyer '67, and J. Robert Peacock II '68.

At the evening ceremony, the crowd was welcomed by Tom Barnico '77, Clerk of the House Corporation for Omie Deut. The invocation was given by the Reverend Jonathan Kalisch, the Chaplain of Aquinas House, the Catholic Student Center at Dartmouth College. James Wright, President Emeritus of Dartmouth, a former member of the United States Marine Corps, delivered very moving remarks about the sacrifices of Dartmouth students during times of war, including those of brothers Smoyer and Peacock, who were students of President Wright during his tenure as a history professor at Dartmouth. Jack Boger '13, an undergraduate member of Omie Deut and an officer candidate in the Marine Corps, gave poignant biographies of each of the honored brothers. An undergraduate singing group, the Dartmouth Aires, sang the National Anthem and the Dartmouth Alma Mater, including its war-time verse. That verse includes the following lines, reproduced in the program for the ceremony:

The Mother keeps them in her heart And guards their altar flame; The still North remembers them, The hill-winds know their name. And the granite of New Hampshire Keeps the record of their fame.



Many alumni attended the ceremony and reception, including Bill Breed '52, and the following friends and classmates of brothers Smoyer and Peacock: Sven Karlen '65, Ed and Rebecca Gray '67, Steve and Linda Jones '67, John Hager '67, Larry Langford '67, Jeff Hinman '68, Wells Chandler '68, Greg Olchowski '68, and Jim Cruikshank '68.

The World War II and Vietnam Memorial Plaque was funded by a generous grant from the Theta Delta Chi Educational Foundation. The new plague complements an existing plague in the room across the hallway on the first floor of the Charge House. The older plaque lists the names of the following four brothers of Omicron Deuteron killed in action in World War I: Sturgis "Spud" Pishon '10; William W. Poole, Jr. '12, Alan F. Waite '15 (winner of the Croix de Guerre), and Thomas C. Nathan '19. The sister plaques will stand a permanent reminders for past, present, and future classes about the ultimate sacrifices made by their brothers.

John Hay, Zeta 1858 (Brown), then serving as Theodore Roosevelt's Secretary of State, executed the Hay-Bunau Varilla Treaty, which recognized Panama's independence and provided the United States with the Panama Canal Zone. Arosemena served on the Panama mission that met on the USS Mayflower to recognize this treaty. Arango served as the first Chief Engineer of Panama, and oversaw the initial efforts to construct the canal on behalf of the newly founded country.
