

## **Convention History**

# Staying Healthy as you prepare to return



The Coronavirus has created a need for the Fraternity to rethink how to conduct our annual Convention. This is not the first time in our 173-year history that our annual Convention has taken a different form. The 69th

Convention in 1917 was cancelled due to the US entry into WWI. Conventions did not reconvene again until 1919 for the 72nd Convention in Philadelphia and was called the Victory Convention. While WWI ended in 1918, the Influenza pandemic may have been another reason for waiting until 1919. In 1941 the 94th Convention was suspended by action of the Grand Lodge because of WWII. Seven Administrative Councils were convened between 1941 and 1947. In 1947 the Centennial Convention was held in New York and we have had an unbroken string of "conventional" Conventions until this year.
