
Theta Delta Chi and the War for Cuban Independence



Theta Delts played prominent roles in the struggle for Cuban Independence. Brothers Mariano E. Aguero y Polhamus, Alpha 1860 and Gonzalo De Quesada, Pi Deuteron 1888, pictured here, were both instrumental in the

Cuban War for Independence from Spain. Bro. Aguero served as a General in the Army of Cuba and was executed by the Spanish in 1875. While Bro. Gonzalo de Quesada was a key architect of Cuba's Independence Movement with Jose Marti and received the National Order of the Legion of Honour of France for his work. Bro. Quesada was a member of the Cuban Constitutional Convention in 1901 and became the minister to the United States and eventually Germany. In 1904 he signed the Hay-Quesada Treaty. John Hay, Zeta 1858 was the Secretary of State for Theodore Roosevelt at the time. A statue of Gonzalo de Quesada stands in a park named in his honor in Havana. Bro Quesada wrote a very moving tribute to his friend and Fraternity Bro Mariano E. Aguero in the March 1893, vol. 9, pp. 8-11 edition of the Shield magazine.

(1981-1983), El Salvador (1983-1985), Israel (1985-1988), the United Nations (1989-1992), India (1992-1993), and Russia (1993-1996). During his tenure with the State Department he served as Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs and currently holds the rank of Career Ambassador, the highest in the U.S. Foreign Service. In 1992 Bro. Pickering was honored by "the Old Lady" with the Theta Delta Chi Achievement Award. Among the praise for Ambassador Pickering: "The Best American Ambassador I've dealt with." King Hussein of Jordan "Arguably the best-ever U.S. representative to that body (United Nations)" New York Times "Five-star General of the diplomatic corp." Time magazine Following his retirement, the U.S. Department of State Foreign Affairs Fellowship Program was renamed the Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship. In, May 2011, Brother Jacob Surface, Upsilon Deuteron '08, was awarded the Pickering Fellowship and now serves as a Foreign Service Officer in Washington D.C.
