

PGL Letter

The start of the New Year is always a time to reflect on the past, while creating resolutions for self-improvement for the future. This time of year, in combination with my second term as President of the Grand Lodge coming to a close, has led me to reflect on



the growth and development of Theta Delta Chi since I became intimately involved with the fraternity's operations as a Charge Consultant in the summer of 2002. Much has changed during these past eight plus years.

The late 90s and early 2000s were a period of declining undergraduate membership and financial instability for the fraternity. I distinctly remember during my first week at the Central Fraternity Office I was told by fellow consultant Jerome Arnold, Xi Deuteron (Washington) '00 that I needed to convince several Charges to pay some of their delinguent bills if I hoped to receive my first paycheck. Fortunately, under the stewardship of Executive Director Bill McClung, Iota Deuteron (Williams) '66 our situation has significantly improved, and the fraternity is now financial solvent and stable.

After the fraternity dipped to its lowest number of active Charges in the spring of 2005 in over a hundred years, the past five years have provided Theta Delta Chi with an unprecedented period of growth. If the upcoming chartering ceremonies of Xi (Hobart), and Upsilon Triton (Indiana) are included, the fraternity has added 9 Charges to our roll during a six-year period. With the addition of the Director of Expansion position to the CFO staff in 2007, I am confident that this trend will continue.

Some of the most significant amendments to our Constitution and Bylaws have been made over the past 8 years. The Charges ratified amendments to separate our Constitution and Bylaws from our ritual in 2005, allowing the former documents to be public for the first time during our fraternity's history. More recently, this past October the Charges ratified amendments to expand the Grand Lodge to seven members: the first expansion of the Grand Lodge since 1909.

Finally, the annual Preamble Institute, first held in 2007, has emerged as Theta Delta Chi's premiere values-based leadership program. Many of the emerging leaders in our fraternity, including both undergraduate members of the Grand Lodge, are graduates of this program, and I confident that PI will contribute to the betterment of our undergraduate members for vears to come.

Like the fraternity, my life has changed significantly over the past 8 plus years. Somehow amidst the chaos and evolution of my life, Theta Delts have been constant stalwarts of support. I was with Branden Yee, Kappa (Tufts) '04 when I met my wife Jackie in December of 2004, Ryan Aggergaard, Xi Deuteron (Washington) '03 stood by my side as my best man in 2006 when Jackie and I married, and Theta Delts like Brett Goldsmith, Chi Deuteron '98 were among the first people I called when I found out Jackie was pregnant with our first child this past October. I am confident that the close friendships I have made through my fraternity experience will endure through the rest of my life.

I have told several brothers that if Jackie and I have a boy, I plan on placing a pledge pin on his diaper immediate after his birth. While I say this half-jokingly, the reality that I am going to be a father has caused me to think a great deal about the future of Theta Delta Chi. I hope that when my son or daughter enters college in the fall of 2029 that he or she will find that the Charge on his or her campus is filled with leaders in the Greek and college communities, composed of men who are committed to the values of our fraternity. If it's a boy, I'll not only be proud if my son chooses to pledge Theta Delta Chi, but I will confident that his brothers will provide him with a safe and enriching learning environment that is better than any other on his campus. If it's a girl, I hope that if she chooses to date a Theta Delt, I will know that she has selected a man committed to improving himself not only intellectually, but that he holds himself to the highest moral ideals.

Now more than ever, I am resolved to make sure that Theta Delta Chi remains relevant in our college community, and that our brothers, young and old, live the values that were so elegantly penned by our founders 163 years ago in Union College's old West College. After all, it is each of our duties to make sure that our brotherhood is perpetuated through all future generations. Will you join me in making this resolution?

Charges Ratify Grand Lodge Expansion

The 163rd Convention last August, after substantial debate, authorized a proposal by the Standing Committee on Legislation to increase the membership of the Grand Lodge from five to seven. The two new members, known as Executive Members, must be alumni. The Charges have subsequently ratified the Convention's action, and the existing Grand Lodge has acted on statutory authority to appoint the new members, who, again subject to Charge ratification, will hold office until the elections at the 164th and 165th Conventions respectively.

he Charitos Society celebrated its inaugural regional event on November 11, 2010, in the great Pacific Northwest at the Seattle Art Museum. Taking advantage of a once in a lifetime opportunity, a group of Seattle area Theta Delts and their spouses and guests were treated to a private reception, lecture and tour of the artist's personal collection — works that he kept for himself with the intent of shaping his own artistic legacy. The exhibition featured over 150 works in a variety of media: paintings, sculptures, drawings, prints and photographs. Every major period from Picasso's eight decades was represented.

The private, one hour slide show and lecture was presented by Professor Marek Wieczorek of the Art History Department of the University of Washington. Michael Powell, Epsilon 1985 (William & Mary), Senior Advisor, Providence Equity Advisors and former Chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, who served on the FCC at a time of revolutionary change in technology and communications, served as Moderator. Mike also sits on the Boards of Cisco, AOL, the Aspen Institute, and America's Promise.

He was joined on the panel by Bob Wood, Sigma Deuteron 1989 (Wisconsin), President, BGR Government Affairs, and former Chief of Staff, Wisconsin Governor and Health and Human Services Secretary Tommy Thompson, and Francisco Carrillo, Psi Deut 1999 (UCLA), Special Assistant to the Assistant Secretary, Department of the Interior, and former Congressional aide to Nancy Pelosi. John Sides, Assistant Professor of Political Science, George Washington University, an expert in American politics and campaigns rounded out the panel.

The event took place at the Fairfax Hotel, a charming facility nestled in Embassy Row. After a welcoming reception, Brother Powell led the panelists in a lively back and forth on the recent mid-term elections and what they meant for 2012. or the second spring semester in a row, the brothers of Lambda Triton will be launching a mentorship program of their own creation to further the philanthropic cause and good name of Theta Delta Chi. The program, called Bros UniteD or BUD, pairs adolescent boys with autism with TDX bros in a 3:1 ratio. It is a seven-week program that meets every Sunday afternoon from January 23-March 6. Each week the TDX Big Bros and their Little Bros do some sort of fun activity



to foster a positive interaction and learning experience for both parties. Before the program starts the participating TDX brothers get a full day of training from a behavioral therapist about the challenges and situations that they might encounter with their Little Brothers and how to best handle those situations. This year the events planned include a meet and greet with the group activity of painting a fraternity paddle, bowling, a kickball game, rock climbing, going to a Rutgers Basketball game, ice skating, a campus scavenger hunt, and an awards dinner where the Big Brothers present their Little Brothers with a competed TDX fraternity paddle.

The main purpose of the program is to provide a positive male role model in the lives of boys who may not have one while also shaping each brother's intellectual, moral, and social being. Bro. Alex Lewis was a member of the original five-person development team and he implemented the program last year. "We wanted to create a program that gave us a hands-on experience within the autism community and gave us a reason to keep raising money for this cause. Our plan is to create a successful program here so then we can help other charges that want to do a similar program at their school." Last year there were 8 Little Bros and 27 Big Bros and this year numbers have increased. "There are 10 Little Bros and 34 Big Bros. Everyone is really excited to be doing the program again and the brothers had a lot of fun. In fact, many of them said it was their favorite event of the semester."

In the past the charge funded the program and in addition, each brother paid a \$30 participation fee. This year, however, Lambda Triton is applying for a grant from the Theta Delta Chi Educational Foundation and the Rutgers University Interfraternity Council. The charge is also trying to get local businesses and restaurants to sponsor the program, but the results remain to be seen. The massive 19 brother planning committee has been working hard to perfect the program in terms of fundraising, event planning, website development, and public relations. Through advertising and public relations the charge is looking to get more people on campus, in the community, and in the international fraternity more aware of the program.

Philanthropy Chair Mike Jacobs had a lot to say about Lambda Triton's philanthropy endeavors. "The Bros UniteD program is just one part of what we are doing at Rutgers for this cause. Every year we raise about \$12,000 for our local Autism Speaks Walk for Autism Research and this year we are going to be participating in the first annual TDX Philanthropy Day on April 15th. And that's not including Dance Marathon or other service initiatives. Even though we were

overlooked last year for both the Philanthropy and Victory Cups, it hasn't stopped us from trying to achieve even more for the Old Lady."

The Bros UniteD program is a brainchild of Undergraduate Secretary to the Grand Lodge, Matthew Cortland, and the Executive Vice President for Programming of Autism Speaks, Peter Bell. The program has been implemented and perfected by Lambda Triton brother Alex Lewis, Bro. Cortland, Peter Bell, and behavioral therapist Katie Curran of Strength Based Behavior Consulting, LLC. This year Bros. Cortland and Lewis head the 19 brother Bros UniteD committee under the supervision of Philanthropy Chair, Mike Jacobs. Bros UniteD is a TDX program that is administered in partnership with Autism Speaks and Strength Based Behavior Consulting.
