

This college has some impressive statistics, ranking #3 for top online Master's in Public Administration Programs from bestcollegereviews.org, #5 for Best Schools for Clinical/Medical Laboratory Sciences in the US from collegefactual.org and #9 for Best Master's Degree Program for Cloud Computing for 2021 from secrutitydegreehub.com.



Tau Triton is only one of three fraternities on the Marist Campus with an impressive roster of more than 40 active brothers. They conduct a very successful Charge developed, ReCharge retreat annually, attended by all of the brothers and is one of their points of pride on the Marist campus. This retreat reviews the values of our Fraternity, reviews the past goals of the Charge, the future direction from the point of view of graduating seniors and the Charge sets goals for the coming year. This retreat focuses on the opening line of the

Preamble with a strong emphasis on the "We" as the first word and then the improvement of the "intellectual, moral and social being." This retreat is one reason for their success on the campus.

**Chuck Muncie, Delta Deuteron '75** played for the New Orleans Saints and San Diego Chargers in the NFL from 1976 to 1984. He was selected to the Pro Bowl three times and tied the then-NFL season record for rushing touchdowns in 1981. *Photo: 1980 AP file photo* 



James Lofton, Eta Deuteron, '78 played for the Green Bay Packers, LA Raiders, Buffalo Bills, LA Rams and Philadelphia Eagles as a wide receiver and was inducted

into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2003. He

**Darrin Nelson, Eta Deuteron '81** was a running back, return specialist for the Minnesota Vikings for eight years and then two years with the San Diego Chargers. **Garin Veris, Eta Deuteron '85** was a defensive end who played six years with the New England Patriots and one year with the San Francisco 49ers. During his career he totaled 36 sacks and seven fumble recoveries. *Photo: Topps* 





**Zak DeOssie, Zeta '07** was a long snapper who played 12 seasons with the New York Giants as number 51. During his time with the Giants Brother DeOssie played in two Pro Bowl games and was part of two Super Bowl championships (XLII and XLVI). James Develin, Zeta '10 played for eight seasons with the New England Patriots where he played fullback and where he participated in winning three Super Bowls and appeared in a Pro Bowl.
