lota Triton was founded in 2005 at the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth. The Charge currently has 19 active members, they are seeing a surge in recruitment and planning for growth due to a reimagined and redesigned recruitment process undertaken by Michael Dickinson, lota Triton '25. There are only six fraternities on this beautiful campus of approximately six thousand undergraduate students, with many of them being commuter students located 60 miles south of Boston. This Charge has much to be proud of including seeing an average GPA of 3.13, an impressive number of community service hours along with participation in such service and philanthropy projects as Gifts to Give, Providence Breast Cancer Walks, the Doug Flutie Foundation, and other local groups. They have participated in the Tau Tetraton DodgeBrawl event and have hosted their own DodgeBrawl fundraiser for the Flutie Foundation. This group generously gives back to their community by raising funds to support food donation projects at one of the local elementary schools.



This group worked with their alumni to update many of the procedural documents that help make a Charge run effectively including their Bylaws, officer manuals, and revised Robert's Rules of Order. If this were not enough for just 19 members, they also brought about the revival of the Greek Council on their campus. During the 2021 Convention, the Charge won the President's Cup and they were the winners of the 2022 Glenn Marston Travel Cup at this year's Convention.



Rudolf F. Peksens, Kappa '66 is most noted for his achievements while in the U.S. Air



Force. In 1966 Brother Peksens completed his degree in Political Science while participating in the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corp Program (AFROTC). Upon graduation, he received his commission in the U.S. Air force and remained in the Air Force until his retirement in 1995 as a Brigadier General. "Rudi" now works as an Independent Consultant in US Defense Planning and Strategy.

While a student at Tufts, "Rudi" was elected the IFC Representative for the Charge two years in a row, he was very active in the Air Force ROTC program and was on the Tufts University Student Council. Leadership runs in his blood!

During his time in the Air Force, Bro. Peksens was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for extraordinary

achievement and the Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster, both while serving in the Vietnam War. The citation for these awards states, "His devotion to duty and courage under all conditions serve as an inspiration to his fellow flyers."

During peacetime, "Rudi" distinguished himself when he was awarded the Defense Superior Service Medal by the Secretary of Defense and the Legion of Merit for exceptional meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services to the government of the United States.

Having met Bro. Peksens twice, I can attest to his devotion to his country and the "Old Lady." Rudi was a guest speaker at the first two Preamble Institute closing dinners and spoke about the lessons learned in the Charge house and how they helped him throughout his career.
